# **Demographic Composition of the House and its Committees**

Last updated December 22, 2020

Congress has historically excluded Black, Brown, and Indigenous people and women -- the majority of American citizens. However, the U.S. House of Representatives is incrementally moving toward reflecting the country that it serves. The 117th Congress will include a record number of women, Black, Latinx, AAPI, and Indigenous members, yet women as well as the Latinx and AAPI communities continue to be vastly underrepresented. Committee leadership is also becoming more demographically representative, but those changes naturally lag changes in House membership.

While both parties improved their gender balance and diversity in the 2020 election, the demographic differences between the Democratic Caucus and Republican Conference are vast. Within each party, gender balance and racial/ethnic diversity varies greatly by committee.<sup>1</sup>
